History of Field Day:

Field Day is an annual <u>amateur radio</u> exercise, widely sponsored by <u>IARU</u> regions and member organizations, encouraging emergency

<u>communications</u> preparedness^[1] among <u>amateur radio operators</u>. In the United States, it is typically the largest single emergency preparedness exercise in the country, with over 30,000 operators participating each year. Field Day is always the fourth full weekend of June, beginning at 18:00 UTC Saturday and running through 20:59 UTC Sunday.

Since the first ARRL Field Day in 1933, radio amateurs throughout North America have practiced the rapid deployment of radio communications equipment in environments ranging from operations under tents in remote areas to operations inside Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs). Operations using emergency and alternative power sources are highly encouraged, since electricity and other public infrastructures are often among the first to fail during a natural disaster or severe weather.

To determine the effectiveness of the exercise and of each participant's operations, there is an integrated competitive component, and many clubs also engage in concurrent leisure activities (e.g., camping, cookouts). Operations typically last a continuous twenty-four hours, requiring scheduled relief operators to keep stations on the air. Additional contest points are awarded for experimenting with unusual modes, making contacts via satellite, and involving youth in the activity.





Remote Field Day Hams results:



Grace Clark, KM6LJL operated a class 1D station from her home in Claremont and made 167 non duplicate contacts on multiple bands, FT4 and FT8. Grace used a ground mounted 31 foot non-resonant multiband vertical and an IC-7300 at 100 watts. The points have been submitted to ARRL for aggregation to GOTAHAMS field day score - a total of 718 points tentatively including the 50-point bonus for digital submission

Dave Wilkie K6EV also operated class 1D with an Icom 7610 at 100 watts into a 23-foot ground mounted trapped vertical. I made 419 contacts using FT4 and FT8 for a tentative total of 1726 points including a 50-point digital submission bonus. I am also attaching a digital summary that shows that I worked all US states and all US ARRL sections. I worked all Canadian RAC sections except Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland/Labrador. I also worked a couple of DX stations that made properly formatted FD calls. (Not shown on map).

Combined, these will contribute 2,444 points to the GOTAHAMS aggregate 2021-point total

Bonus Points 1150

An Eastvale flyer advertising the Gotahams Field Day at Cedar Creek Park on Saturday, June 26, 2021, was published in the Eastvale Newsletter distributed to their residents. 210 contacts were made while introducing the Eastvale residents to Amateur Radio. Our guest book was signed by 29 Amateur Radio operators and families from the surrounding area. There was an additional 21 Amateur Radio operators and family members who helped set-up canopies & antennas, operate radios and acting as ambassadors for Amateur Radio's Open House. The Gotahams WG6OTA operated as Class 4A with 4 stations.

Radio Operators: Jack KM6UNQ, Craig KM6EIC, Jose KK6JM, Emilia KJ6EMM and Shaun K6CT used a FLEX 6400M for SSB contacts. George WB6OEB, Shaun K6CT, Maribel KN6HSW, Wayne KA6BMZ were contacting Amateur Radio operators all over the world using with a Yaesu FT991 and Tri Band Beam.

Tim N6DLC and Bruce KM6WBI used a Yaesu 991A to make 65 Digital Contacts. ARRL Southwestern Director Dick Norton, N6AA, visited Field Day 2021 also visits from Eastvale City Council members. Our Safety Officer walked around the site making sure guy wires were marked with fluorescent cones and fall zones for antennas were clearly marked by caution tape- 2021 total points were 1,906


