Marconi Net

The Marconi Net took place on January 10, 2026 with no problems. In the past we have had issues with the WG6OTA or the GB3IW repeaters or if the internet is down at either location the net can't happen. But lately it has been working great. We had a good time talking with our hams across the pond, in the UK.

If you wish to join a future Marconi net the next one will be on **February 14 from 11:00 am - 12:00 pm**. Please be aware these are open repeaters, and we welcome guests. As usual, we encourage all participants to completely ignore (do not acknowledge in any way) any intentional interference during this or any other net.

The WG6OTA repeater on Sunset Ridge, North of Claremont, in Southern California, will be linked to the GB3IW repeater, near Cowes, on the Isle of Wight, in the UK. The KS7MC repeater (Spirit Mountain Amateur Radio Club) in Fort Mohave Arizona may also be linked during these nets.

No special radio programming is required, just access the WG6OTA repeater as usual and it will be linked to GB3IW.

Keep transmissions to less than 2 minutes and allow time for a FULL carrier drop (by the repeater) between transmissions. We do ask that participants pay special attention to avoid time outs.

Simplex Net

The Simplex net will be back on January **28**, after a two month hiatus for Thanksgiving and Christmas. The Simplex net will be on **146.580MHz** starting at 6:15pm. A great way to explore the reach of your 2 meter equipment without the benefit of repeater, both receiving and transmitting. Bring a pad of paper and record signal reports for all you hear. We will collect your reports on the net.

Our next simplex net will take place on **February 25 from 6:15 pm - 7:00 pm**, on the fourth Wednesday each month.

VE Testing

Our next VE testing session will take place at **Brackett Field on February 28 @ 1:00 pm - 5:00 pm**.

Tests will be held on the LAST Saturday of each month (EXCEPT DECEMBER) at 1PM in the Pilots Lounge of the Brackett Field airport in La Verne (map below). Walk-ins are allowed, but you are strongly encouraged to contact Frank at 909-257-7205 in advance. Please leave a message with your contact information and indicate which license level(s) you are pursuing.

Please bring \$15.00 for the A.R.R.L. VEC exam fee. (\$5 if under 18). Payment must be cash or check – no credit cards or electronic payment methods. Also, please review the ‘preparation’ link below to ensure that you have completed the other required preparations for a successful test. **You MUST bring an FCC FRN number** to the test event – contact us if you need help with creating this on the FCC website. Successful candidates will be contacted by the FCC for payment of any additional fees due before issuance of the license.
